About the College

Staines Memorial College is an independent, co-educational, Christian College catering for students from Kindy to Year 12 in the Ipswich Region. The College is owned and operated by Christian Community Ministries (CCM). All staff at the College are committed followers of Jesus from a variety of denominational backgrounds, selected for their professional competence as well as their sense of calling to the ministry of a Christian School.

We cater for children from a variety of Christian backgrounds and traditions. We also cater for families who, though not necessarily Christian themselves, desire a Christian school culture and educational experience for their children.

The College is named in honour of Graham Staines and his sons, Philip and Timothy who were killed in 1999 as they served our God in the poor and rural areas of India. Like others before them, and since, the Staines family were extending God's mercy to poor communities, and communities affected by leprosy. Graham and his wife Gladys grew up in the Ipswich - Beaudesert areas.

As a college we seek to continue the ethos of the Staines family through providing a holistic Christian education, and by developing a culture of service to others.

How attendance is managed

Parents notify the College through the Parent Portal when their child is absent from the College.

Attendance is recorded by teachers when the morning rolls are marked on our School Management Software. An SMS is sent to parents who have not notified the College of their child's absence and parents are expected to respond with an explanation. If a parent does not respond to the SMS, they are then phoned.

Our Student Wellbeing Team can assist with school refusal or any underlying problems that may be hindering a child's desire to attend school regularly.
